Food and fruit waste, including seafood, egg shells, dry fruit, small bones and expired/rotten foods, coffee leftovers and non-plastic coffee pods, teabags, paper tissues, small garden waste, lawn cuttings, plants and leaves, takeaway pizza boxes with food leftovers.



PLASTICS and METALS

SUNDAY | WEDNESDAY

Plastic containers of personal care and household products, plastic plates and glasses, nets for fruits or vegetable. Food tray containers, plastic bags, polystyrene packages. Aluminium foils, aluminium containers, aluminium beverage cans, tins and crown corks, steel cans.



GLASS

THURSDAY

glass bottles, glass tins and jars, glass cups, vases and jugs.



PAPER and CARDBOARDS

TUESDAY | FRIDAY

Newspapers, magazines, various paper, wrapping paper and food and drink's paper packages, takeaway pizza boxes without food leftovers, tetrapak, train tickets, paper bags, gift wrapping paper, drawing paper.



GENERAL WASTE

MONDAY

Pens, diapers, sanitary pads and tampons, chewing gum, cigarette butts, toys, wax paper, cd-dvd, ceramic plates and cups, razors, toothbrushes, chemical letters for pets, plastic cutlery. All non-recyclable waste.
